IMSHOF Congress in Cancun

The purpose of this 2-hour Congress is to facilitate discussion and learning amongst the attending Honorees and Executive Committee members (and their guests). IMSHOF consulted widely and have set a few topics in advance. It is not expected that any major decisions will be made during the Congress. The sport doesn't work that way – and IMSHOF is not able to enforce key sport-wide decisions.

There was a Congress in Cork (2013) informal and London (2017).

Topics

1. A very short description of IMSHOF What we are/do:

Recognize the world's most successful (marathon is 10 km +) swimmers in competitive races, individuals for their solo swim exploits plus contributors (administrators, coaches, pilots, organizations, etc.) to the sport.

A non-profit educational sports hall of fame (nobody is paid and IMSHOF runs on a tiny budget) devoted to marathon swimming and is dedicated to promoting the Honorees and the sport.

Two initiatives; standards for Majors and Records; and nomination standards: unassisted (unless noted), km, straight line measure and generally ratified/witnessed.





What we are not/do not do: Swim ratification/accreditation body International control/governing body Engage in controversy

Incomplete Honoree Details

IMSHOF tries to gather and preserve key details about Honorees. We have a few data holes we hope to fill:

13 missing dates of birth/dates of passing

22 missing second contacts used where all other methods to reach an Honoree are exhausted. This contact, can unfortunately be important when we receive a rumor about a death.

10 living Honorees (without any known video in existance) are still deciding on a recorded career interview. Read the post below – sometimes these interviews are the only/best video in existance and "bring the Honoree back in voice and image for decades to come".

Unfortunately, each year we generally lose at least one Honoree. They are remembered in the annual Induction & Awards Ceremony booklet. In Cancun in May we'll remember Honoree Carlos Larriera (Argentina – Class of 1969). He was a winner and later organizer of the Santa Fe Coronda swim and the vice president of the World Professional Marathon Swimming Federation. In 2021 we remembered Herman Willemse in the booklet <u>Class of 2021/2020 Virtual</u> <u>IMSHOF</u>. Herman from the Netherlands was in the inaugural Class of 1963. He described his close relationship with Carlos <u>Herman Willemse on WOWSA Live (youtube.com)</u> from 8:50. Herman also won the Santa Fe Coronda swim plus 11 Majors and was the president of the World Professional Marathon Swimming Federation.

Both Honoree swimmers worked to ensure that their professional marathon circuit survived in parallel with the International Marathon Swimming Association until they merged into the International Marathon Swimming Federation (then renamed as Association) in 1991 which led into FINA.
