The Sea Goddess is official trophy of the International Marathon Swimming Hall of Fame. It evokes the sea's qualities of movement, rhythm, and temperament in a timeless portrait of a woman. One side is stormy and tumultuous, the other, pacific, and serene - overall mystery and beauty. All inducted swimmers and contributors are named on the plaques on the Sea Goddess.

#### IMSHOF Electronic Library - Filing Proposal

This is a proposal. Input, ideas and comments are welcome - email info@imshof.org

<u>Purpose:</u> Establish an electronic library to house IMSHOF documents, pictures and videos that will be open to the public. The vast majority of information about the sport will continue to be housed in other locations: IMSHOF website (including the shared Honoree spreadsheet – at the bottom of page <u>Biography Notes | IMSHOF</u> – so you can run your own analyses, Openwaterpedia, MSF's longswims, organizational websites (Honor organizations and more), media libraries, WOWSA articles, etc.

<u>Decision to use "common files":</u> as opposed to a content management software engine. Content management engines such as SharePoint have a potential license cost, upgrade cost, inertia in filling in mandatory index fields, long term survivability and complex user issues (which will lessen usage).

**<u>Primary file decision:</u>** – will be based on organizations and events. Example – a picture of

Honoree David Alleva, PhD winning the Atlantic City race in 1989 will be filed in the Atlantic City folder. Ideally the name of the file will include the words: Alleva (no titles, accents, forenames), Atlantic City and 1989. Materials filed in the Individual Honoree folder will be general. Part of this logic is driven by the reality that pictures/articles (related to events) often list several Honorees.

<u>How to search:</u> go directly to organizations and events, pick a folder and then subfolder – and search by year and/or Honoree name (often just surname). Then go to the Honoree folder and either browse or seach on key words.

<u>Evolution of the Folder, File, Indexing and Searching Plan:</u> will happen as current materials are named (and renamed), new materials are obtained, and more decisions made on filing. Future user feedback will help dictate the evolution of the file plan.

<u>Decision process:</u> this proposal was shared with the IMSHOF Executive Committee plus some key IMSHOF Honoree researchers including Steven Muñatones; Evan Morrison; Julian Critchlow; Dr. Tim Johnson, DPS, PE; Bryan Finlay, PhD; Julie Ridge; and Penny Lee Dean. We are now sharing this proposal with the wider community – to get more input.
