3. New Honorees – International Swimming Hall of Fame

Two IMSHOF Honorees will be amongst the 11 new inductees to ISHOF: Ferry Weertman - Netherlands (Open Water Swimmer) and Sid Cassidy – United States of America (Contributor):

[Ferry Weertman](#) won 3 Majors: 2016 Rio Olympics, 2017 10 km FINA World Championship and 2018 FINA World Series Cup. He was the first male winner of both the Olympics and the 10 km World Championships. Ferry won two silvers at the 2015 FINA World Championships in the 10 km and 5 km mixed team event; and gold at the 10 km European Championships in 2014, 2016 and 2018 and mixed team event in 2014 and 2018. He competed for 10 years at the FINA level: 29 events in 17 countries and 10 podiums (34%) all 1st and 2nd. He also excelled in the pool and was a finalist (8th) at the World Championships in the 4x200 freestyle relay in 2017 in Budapest.



[S.A. "Sid" Cassidy](#) served in all aspects of the sport: as an athlete, coach, and race director, but Sid's greatest influence in the sport has been achieved as the result of his work as chairman of the FINA/WA Technical Open Water Swimming Committee, where he had oversight of the FINA 10 km Marathon Swimming World Cup circuit, the FINA Open Water Swimming Grand Prix series and the FINA World Open Water Swimming Championships. Under his leadership, marathon swimming was added to the Olympic program starting at the 2008 Beijing Olympics.

6. In Memoriam - Irene Wakeham

Please let us know if you hear of the passing of other Honorees (or long-term committee members of Honor Organizations).

Irene Wakeham died 19 October 2025

Every summer (which gets longer and longer) for more than 25 years, Irene was part of the "beach crew" in Dover England. An unpaid volunteer she helped aspiring English Channel swimmers: greeting them by name, checked them in/out of the water, "guarded" their clothes bags, met them hourly at the water's edge with drink bottles of carbo-mix, encouraged them to keep going, made sure they staggered back after to their clothes after long sessions (sometime 10+ hours), and told them that they were wonderful and on-track for a future success. Every swimmer knew that Irene cared about them as individuals.

From 2004 to 2019 she observed on 86 solo swims and 51 relay swims, a total of 137 swims - a remarkable achievement and was recognized by the Channel Swimming and Piloting Federation twice with the Observer of the Year trophy.
