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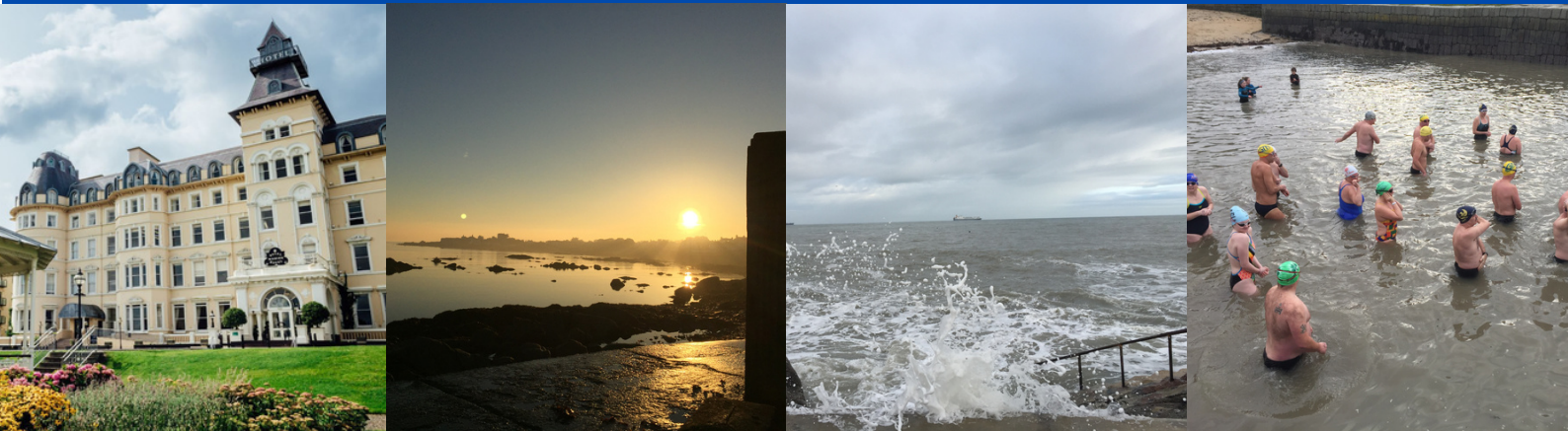

The four International Marathon Swimming Hall of Fame (MSHOF) Honorees from Ireland invite you to join us as proud hosts of the Class of 2027 Induction and Awards Ceremony on 8th May 2027. The venue will be the Royal Marine Hotel in Dun Laoghaire (10 km from Dublin City Center) just up from Dublin Bay.



Irish Long Distance Swimming Association (Class of 2012)

Founded in 1966, organized more than 300 open water events, ratification of the North Channel swims (part of the Oceans Seven), and host of the 150+ attendee annual open water awards ceremony.



Ned Denison (Class of 2012)

Started the Sandycove Island Swim Club; Blackrock to Cobh swim (now known as the 16 km Cork to Cobh swim); Cork Distance Week in 2009; Ireland Champion of Champions Swim; Around Cork swim. Currently Chairperson of IMSHOF.



Stephen Redmond (Class of 2017)

First swimmer to complete the Oceans Seven and pioneers Fastnet Rock swims which now boasts many successful solo successes in one, two and three way crossings.



Jacqueline McClelland (Class of 2026)

Co-Founder and Director of infinity Channel Swimming and instrumental in increasing the availability of swims across the North Channel: 1947-2016: 34 solos; 2017 to present: 150 solos.

Ted Kennan (Class of 1984)

The second to complete the original triple crown: English Channel in 1972; North Channel in 1973 in 8.8-11°C; and the 26.8 km Bristol Channel in 1975 in a record time of 14 hours and 26 minutes.



Billy Wallace (Class of 1999)

Served for more than 40 years in various management roles (Honorary President, Honorary Secretary) of the IMSHOF Honor Organization Irish Long Distance Swimming Association (ILDSA) from 1979.

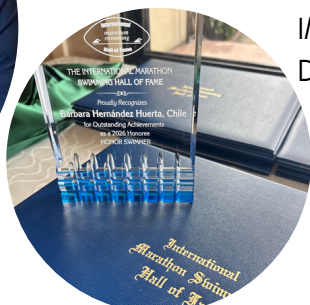

“Why is Ireland hosting this event?”

The Saturday night Induction and Awards Ceremony will be part of a full weekend – including Friday casual reception, Saturday am swim at the historic forty foot, Congress for Honorees and casual get togethers. For some international attendees we anticipate they will stay for a week (or more) for tourism and other swims around the island.

The IMSHOF Class of 2013 Induction and Awards Ceremony was held in Cork, Ireland together with Global Open Water Swimming. More than 300 attended the Ceremony. The Class of 2026 Ceremony in San Diego set a high bar: 130 attendees (record for a standalone Conference) and a record 30 Honorees. With your support, we aspire to raise that bar!

Some may be asking: ‘Why is Ireland hosting this event ?

Some may be asking the second question: “Why are there so many interested and successful marathon swimmers in Ireland?”

A few of the reasons: A small(ish) island with lots of coastline, Less than ten 50 meters pools on the island – which encourages open water swimming and lots of cold water.

Ireland’s selection to host the 2027 International Marathon Swimming Hall of Fame Awards and Induction Ceremony is not simply about geography. It reflects Ireland’s emergence as one of the most influential nations in modern marathon swimming.

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EVERYONES A WEE BIT IRISH!

Ireland occupies a unique position within the sport. It combines a rich historical legacy, world-renowned marathon swim routes, a rapidly expanding open-water community, and an organisational structure that has become a model internationally. IMSHOF itself announced that the Class of 2027 Inductions and Awards Ceremony will take place in Dublin on 8th May 2027, recognising Ireland's distinctive contribution to marathon swimming.

Several factors explain why Ireland earned the prestige of hosting the event:

-  The North Channel is widely regarded as one of the most demanding marathon swims in the world and forms part of the prestigious Oceans Seven challenge. Its cold water, powerful currents, unpredictable weather, and rough sea conditions attract elite swimmers from across the globe.
-  Participation continues to grow at an extraordinary rate. Solo North Channel crossings are projected to exceed 200 by 2026, reflecting Ireland's growing importance as a global destination for marathon swimmers. North Channel is an Oceans Seven swim and is part of the Irish Triple Crown, Original Triple Crown and NEWS Swim series,
-  IMSHOF Honour Organisation Class of 2012 Irish Long Distance Swimming Association (ILDSA) has become one of the most respected marathon swimming organisations internationally. The organisation ratifies more than 150 marathon swims annually, maintains extensive historical records, administers major channel swims, and actively promotes the sport at every level. www.ildsa.info
-  Ireland consistently produces successful marathon swimmers despite having relatively few 50-metre pools. This has fostered a culture where swimmers develop directly in open water, building resilience, adaptability, and cold-water capability from an early stage.
-  Irish swimming conditions naturally create world-class endurance athletes. Sea temperatures, air temperatures, strong tides, and challenging surface conditions are often considered tougher than those encountered in the English Channel, making Ireland an ideal proving ground for marathon swimming.
-  Ireland has a deep historical connection to the sport. Irish swimmers and contributors have long been recognised by IMSHOF, including pioneers such as Ted Keenan, who became the first Irishman to complete the English Channel, North Channel, and Bristol Channel and was inducted into the Marathon Swimming Hall of Fame and honoree Stephen Redmond first to complete Oceans Seven,
-  The country offers exceptional diversity for open-water swimming. Within a relatively small island are lakes, rivers, sheltered bays, exposed Atlantic coastlines, and internationally recognised channel crossings, all set against some of the most striking scenery in Europe.
-  Ireland has also become a centre of leadership within the sport. IMSHOF Chairperson Ned Denison is based in Ireland, and Irish administrators, volunteers, observers, pilots, coaches, and swimmers have played a significant role in shaping modern marathon swimming internationally.

Ultimately, Ireland was chosen because it represents everything IMSHOF seeks to celebrate: history, endurance, community, innovation, and a deep connection to open water. Hosting the 2027 Awards in Dublin acknowledges not only Ireland's contribution to marathon swimming's past, but also its central role in the future growth of the sport.



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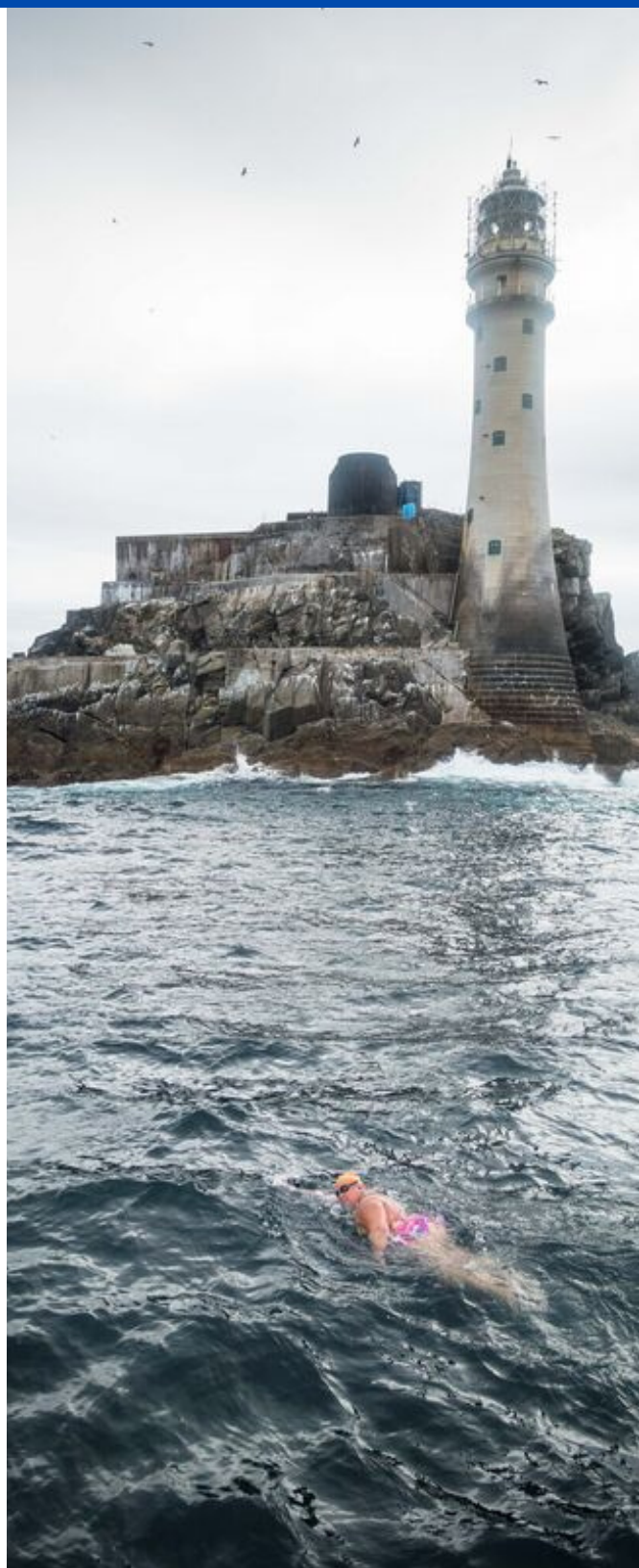

TO BOOK ROYAL MARINE HOTEL

To book the Royal Marine Hotel

1. Email reservation@royalmarine.ie or shirley@royalmarine.ie with name, arrival and departure dates and event code/reservation ID '387549'. The discount code in the email is only the night of 8th - but they will probably extend it for early bookings.
2. You should then receive an email asking you to phone 00 353 1 23 000 30 with name, address, and credit card details (to hold not to charge before checkin). They will read off your reservation number (write it down).
3. Then you get an email confirmation - double check your arrival and departure dates.

There are many other options to stay 1 km from the hotel (probably even rent a sail boat to sleep in?). Or you can stay most places in Central Dublin and take the bus or Luas/Dart train to the hotel.

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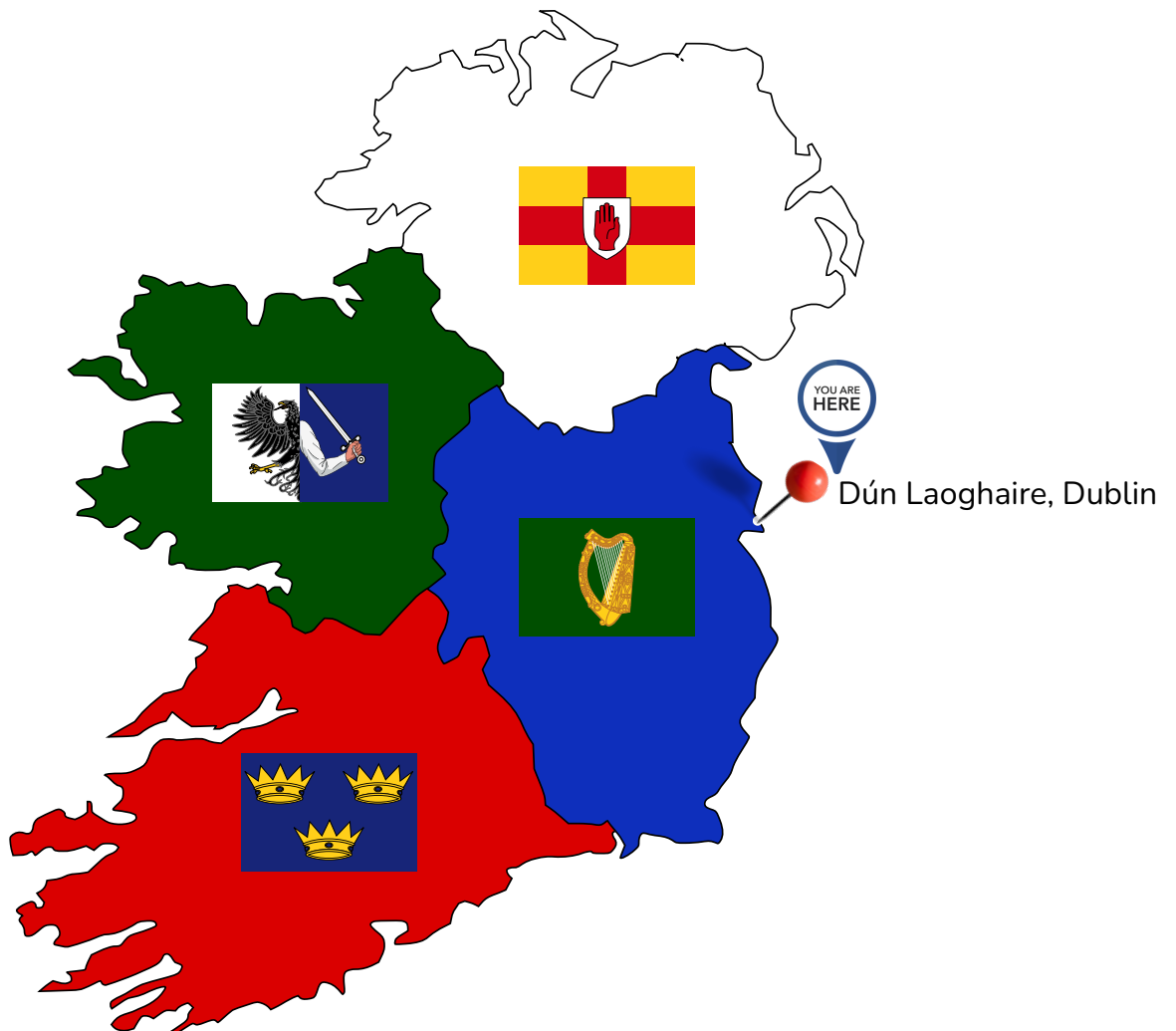

The Cobblestone (Smithfield): Widely considered the best spot in Dublin for "real" trad music, this family-owned pub hosts authentic acoustic sessions every single day of the week. It draws a great local crowd.

O'Donoghues (Merrion Row): An absolute Dublin institution where legendary groups like The Dubliners got their start. It is steeped in history and features fantastic folk and traditional music.

Devitt's (Camden Street): Known for hosting fantastic, energetic traditional sessions—especially on Sunday afternoons. They feature live upstairs music almost every night. [1]

The Brazen Head (Bridge Street): Claiming the title of Dublin's oldest pub (established in 1198), it offers a charming, historic ambiance where you can enjoy folk music and traditional food.

The Celt (Talbot Street): Just a short walk from The Spire, this spot has a genuine, welcoming Irish feel and hosts live traditional music daily.

Little Museum of Dublin: An award-winning museum that tells the story of the city through charming 29-minute guided tours.

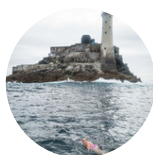
