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Irish Long Distance Swimming Association, Honor Organization

(ILDSA) was founded in 1966 with the aim of promoting open water swimming. The ILDSA organized more than 300 open water events, providing thousands of swimmers an opportunity to compete at the highest levels. The ILDSA established development races that introduce pool swimmers to the outdoor environment. Key races included: Belfast Lough; Clew Bay; Dublin Bay; Shannon Estuary; Lough Neagh; Carlingford Lough; and Rathlin Sound. Lough Erne served as the annual championship. For some, these races also helped prepare the swimmers for the English and North Channels.

The ILDSA serves as the ratification body for the North Channel – part of the Oceans Seven challenge. They also offer marathon ratification for marathon swims in Ireland - listed on their [database](#). Starting in 2010, the ILDSA have organized an annual open water awards ceremony which now includes the induction for the Marathon Swimming Hall of Fame – Ireland.
