Nominations must be submitted by Friday 15th September 2023 12pm Australian EST (14th September 2023 10pm USA EST) to allow an adequate period for internal factual, ethics and viability review.

Success criteria for IMSHOF ceremonies

A short time ago we asked our selection panel and honorees what preferences they have for the ceremonies. Here are the results:

- A successful ceremony for IMSHOF needs to be at least a 2 day "weekend"
- Near an international airport with good connections
- Review the "lessons learned" from previous ceremonies and don't have the same problems
- Casual dinner plans for Friday night for small groups
- Location to mingle/drink before the ceremony dinner
- Classy dinner (not a buffet) usually on a Saturday in early May (avoiding Western & Eastern Easter)
- Dress code men in jackets and long trousers
- Professional presentation stage, audio-visual and video recording
- 80+ attendees
- 15+ individuals wearing sashes at the end of the ceremony
- Minimum 4 new inductees/award winners in attendance
- Minimum 3 Executive Committee members attending
- Runs for less than 150 minutes (2.5 hours) starting with the first talk after dinner presenters practice on Zoom well in advance
- Fewer than 10 individuals leave early
- The next ceremony location announced and the host in attendance to "learn"
- Plan for an "afters" meeting place often at the main hotel bar
- A 2-hour "congress/conference" to discuss topics of interest
- A 2- hour Executive Committee meeting with timing to allow non-attendees to call in
- A local swim
- Possible tourist events/tours
