



Diane Struble, Honor Swimmer, United States of America, 2023

Diane Struble was a trailblazing swimmer in the late 1950s. She completed two first ever swims of 32.7 km across Lake Champlain and 51.8 km length of Lake George. Diane was the eighth swimmer to circle Manhattan Island – 30 years after the seventh swimmer and completed a 32 km Boston harbor swim. She received considerable media attention. An estimated 10,000 people (including spectators in 200 boats) witnessed her Lake George swim for which she received \$25,000 (in 2022 value). She appeared on USA popular television shows: “The Today Show”, “I’ve Got a Secret”, “To Tell the Truth”, and “What’s My Line” and became an inspiration to a generation of woman (single mothers were not common or “public”) and aspiring athletes.

Diane swam around Manhattan breaststroke and without a cap adding to her spectator appeal.
