Great news – ISHOF has recently added <u>Paralympians to their Honor process</u>.


Several years ago IMSHOF added Ethics (starting with a WADA drugs failure) as a requirement to enter and/or remain in the Hall. At the time there were very few other organizations with similar policies. ISHOF have now <u>published explicit criteria and process</u> and interestingly Major League Baseball <u>failed to induct anyone this year</u> with Ethics questions clouding the records of the top nominees.
